Significant Events

1 District:

Theft of Motor Vehicle
Lake Seymour Drive

On Thursday April 4th @ 7:00 am, The victim reported that a 2015 White Ram truck was stolen. The vehicle was parked in front of the residence, with the keys left in the center console. The vehicle was located in the area South Ridge Ave., on Friday April 5th. Other vehicles, that were left unsecured were entered and rummaged through during the same timeframe as the stolen vehicle.

Theft by False Pretense (Counterfeit USC)

On Sunday April 21st @ 3:00 pm, Officers responded to several area businesses regarding two subjects using counterfeit \$100.00 bills to purchase merchandise. The businesses that were impacted by the theft were Dollar Tree on N. Broad St. and South Ridge Ave., and the Crab Cake Factory. Officers were provided a vehicle description used by the suspects and were able to locate the vehicle. **Terrel Gibbs**, male 35 and **Zachary Clinton**, male 33 were taken into custody. Both Gibbs and Clinton were charged accordingly and issued \$8000.00 Secured bond.
